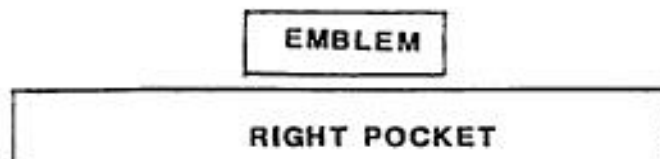


BOY SCOUTS OF CANADA HONOURS AND AWARDS

WEARING OF EMBLEMS

The emblems of the SILVER WOLF, BAR TO THE SILVER ACORN, SILVER ACORN, BAR TO THE MEDAL OF MERIT, MEDAL OF MERIT, MEDAL FOR GOOD SERVICE and the LONG SERVICE MEDAL are worn on the uniform centred one inch (25mm) above the RIGHT breast pocket.



If more than one emblem is worn, the senior emblem is worn on the RIGHT



On formal or ceremonial occasions, decorations are worn suspended around the neck. If more than one honour has been received, only the senior decoration will be worn. An adult wearing an emblem conferred upon them as a youth will wear it above the RIGHT pocket and to the RIGHT of honours received as an adult.

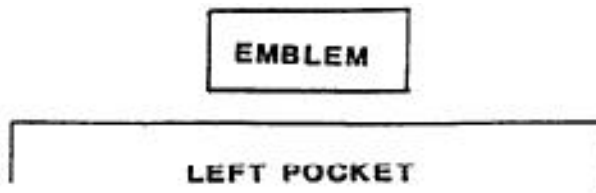
THE GREEN LOOP OF THE SILVER WOLF EMBLEM GOES TO THE WEARER'S RIGHT.



THE BROWN ROPE END OF THE LONG SERVICE MEDAL EMBLEM GOES TO THE WEARER'S RIGHT.



The emblems of the JACK CORNWELL DECORATION, GOLD, SILVER and BRONZE CROSSES, CERTIFICATE FOR GALLANTRY, MEDAL and CERTIFICATE FOR MERITORIOUS CONDUCT are worn by Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Venturers and Rovers in uniform. Rovers, Venturers and Scouts will wear the emblem centered and one inch (25mm) above the LEFT breast pocket. Cubs and Beavers will wear the emblem in a similar position on the jersey or vest.



Adults will wear the emblem above the RIGHT pocket. When the decoration is worn it is attached directly below the emblem.

The emblem of an honour conferred upon a section is attached to the section flag adjacent to the carrying pole. On formal or ceremonial occasions the decoration is fastened below the emblem.
